




BIOGRAPHY

SA Today Bestselling author Vicki Hinze has attracted well over a million readers with her healing-themed stories that cross genres and boundaries by incorporating three elements: suspense, mystery and romance. "Beyond that," she says, "all bets are off" on the type of story readers find between the covers of her award-winning books. She's has written in nearly every genre--including a few that didn't yet exist, like the military romantic thriller.

Vicki co-created the first single-title, openended continuity series, the first military romantic thriller, and received the Career Achievement Award for blazing new trails in genre-blending. A proponent of pay back and pay it forward, she's mentored over two-thousand writers and sponsored an array of special projects and programs to assist writers. A charter sponsor of International Thriller Writers, she served as VP on its board, acted as a consultant to the Romance Writers of America board of directors, and has served various other organizations in similar capacities. Vicki was named the first PRO Mentor of the Year by RWA and was also honored with the National Service Award.





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Q & A

Questions and Answers from Prior Interviews



I'm flattered to be considered an authority. The truth is I do enormous amounts of research, develop a novel plan, and then consult with experts to make sure the plan is feasible. I also read a lot of related material that provides insights. One of the joys in writing for me is to take dissimilar things, combine them, and work out kinks in that kind of mental pretzel to create a realistic story. I'm a bit stubborn as well as a risk-taker, so of course the moment someone tells me I can't do something, I have to see whether or not I can. As the wife of a former Hurricane Hunter and Special Operations military guy, I'm judicious about what I write, and always do so with an eye to not putting those at risk at greater risk. For that reason, I often alter disciplines or methods, though I do note that I'm altering them so readers don't misunderstand and deem the changes faulty research.

Why do you write so many different types of novels?

Bluntly put, I'm a purpose writer. That means every book I write, I write for a purpose. My theme is healing. So often my purpose in a project is to help the broken heal. All of my stories have healing themes, all contain elements of suspense, mystery and romance. From there the elements vary, which is why I'm perceived to write a lot of different types of books. But at the core, those things remain the same. Others classify the works--publishers, editors, reviewers, readers. I need that healing theme and those three elements to love a book, and that's been my one writing rule my entire career: I will not write a book I don't love.

Why is that one writing rule so important to you--refusing to write a book you don't love?

Writing a book takes time, commitment and discipline. It looks easy, but it's really not. So from the start, I promised myself I wouldn't write a book a don't love because my time and where and how I spend it is very important to me. I don't want to waste a second. Neither do I want to waste a second of a reader's time. When you write commercial fiction, you create a bond of trust with the reader. As a writer, you owe that reader your best. If you don't love a book, you can't give it your best. That's unfair to yourself, but also to your readers. Both deserve better. Both deserve your best.
